Congratulations!

At the time of your purchase, your puppy has been thoroughly vet checked, received age appropriate vaccinations, and cleared to go on their life adventures.

Here are a few things to note when your new puppy is brought into their new home:

1. Puppies are easily stressed when they travel and while adjusting to their new environment. If you are traveling a lengthy distance, they can develop Coccidiosis which is easily treated by your vet. Symptoms in young dogs include diarrhea with mucus and blood, poor appetite, vomiting, and dehydration. Untreated, the disease can be fatal. Puppies are like people and need time to adjust.
2. They may not eat or drink much for a few days after they are in their new home - Pureed pumpkin (canned) may help to firm up loose stool. Add a tablespoon or two to the kibble. You can make treats out of frozen pumpkin to help with teething as well.
3. Puppies sometimes are hypoglycemic, or low blood sugar, so we suggest keeping NutriCal or Karo syrup on hand. PLEASE KEEP AN EYE OUT FOR SUGAR DROPS IN THE FIRST FEW DAYS OF HAVING YOUR NEW PUPPY! *This is a condition where the blood sugar level drops to an extremely low level due to lack of food, or by using up all stored energy without it being replenished. (Such as when your puppy plays for an extended period of time without eating.) The most common trigger is stress (such as going to a new home). Sugar drops are especially dangerous to small breeds of puppies. PLEASE TREAT YOUR NEW PUPPY LIKE YOU WOULD A BABY AND TAKE EVERY PRECAUTION AGAINST IT HAVING A SUGAR DROP. One way to help prevent this is to feed your new puppy several times a day and especially before going to sleep at night by giving it a small amount of wet food. A good indicator of a puppy's health is the color of its gums. The gums should appear pink in color.*
4. It is recommended that you have a crate and a quiet place for your new puppy to settle in. A Snuggle Puppy can be used to help calm a puppy. This stuffed animal puppy has a simulated heartbeat that mimics the ones from littermates.
5. It is highly recommended that you do not take your puppy out in public, place it on the ground to potty, and do not let it around other dogs until it has had all its shots and cleared by your vet. This way you will keep your puppy healthy, and help prevent Parvo, which is the number one killer in puppies. If you allow your puppy to touch the ground, or take it to a public place, and it contracts Parvo or any other disease, this health guarantee will become void.
6. Xylitol (also labeled birch sugar) is extremely toxic to dogs and puppies. Even small amounts of Xylitol can cause hypoglycemia (low blood sugar), seizures, liver failure or even death in dogs. Xylitol is a "sugar alcohol," a natural sugar substitute that, because of its anti-cavity properties for human teeth, is commonly found in "sugar-free" gum, mints, toothpastes, and mouthwashes. Since it's also considered a good sugar substitute for diabetics, Xylitol is commonly used in sugar-free baked goods too, such as cookies and muffins. Xylitol is also present in some brands of children's chewable vitamins and other supplements. And it's now even being added to certain brands of PEANUT BUTTER! Xylitol is far more toxic to dogs than chocolate, so please double check the ingredients of your products.
7. TOXIC TO DOGS: Please check the toxicity of plants to dogs in which your puppy may have access to. Some innocent looking plants can be highly toxic to dogs. Air fresheners, candles, and other scented sprays can be toxic to dogs.
8. Please treat your new puppy like you would a newborn child. Protect it from the environment and shower it with love.
9. Please do your research on the cost of owning a new pet, including the cost of vet bills, food, medicine, supplies, and toys.
10. Placing puppies in good homes is our top priority and we reserve the right to refuse selling a puppy if we believe it is not a good fit. Please understand we consider these puppies as part of our extended family and want nothing but the best for them in their forever homes. We do our absolute best to match the pups with their perfect family.

Your 72-hour guarantee: Take your puppy to your vet to be checked! (It's always best to make an appointment a few days prior to bringing your puppy home). **PLEASE CALL YOUR VET TO INQUIRE ABOUT THE COST OF A WELLNESS EXAM BEFORE PURCHASING YOUR PUPPY!**

We will NOT be responsible for any costs whatsoever associated with Veterinary or Health Care Expense (including the initial checkup / wellness exam) after the puppy leaves our premises.

We will not be responsible for the following: Coccidia, Parvovirus, Hypoglycemia, umbilical hernia, parasites including worms, Giardia, ear mites, or yeast as these are not genetic and can be common in Puppies. We deworm at 2 & 4 weeks with Pyrantel and 6 weeks with Panacur and regularly thereafter.

Because overvaccination can cause serious health consequences, any vaccination given before the Dog is due for its next vaccine will VOID this guarantee in its entirety. All of our dogs have completed their regimen of immunization to their age-appropriate vaccination schedule at the time of delivery. It is the Buyer's responsibility to set up an ongoing appropriate vaccination schedule with the Buyer's vet along with setting up any deworming protocols.

We follow a very strict preventative worming schedule as directed by our vet. We cannot guarantee the Dog against illness or opportunistic parasite brought on by the stress of moving (from our location to Buyer's location), shipping, or motion sickness resulting from being transported. This stress can ignite illnesses and opportunistic parasites such as worms, hypoglycemia (sugar drop) or coccidia (dormant in most live animals), giardia, kennel cough, etc. Seller also does not guarantee the Dog to be "worm-free" as this is an on-going process that, once the Dog is out of Seller's control, is the responsibility of the Buyer. Worms are easily and economically treated, and should they occur SELLER WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY EXPENSES OR OTHER COSTS THAT THE BUYER MAY INCUR.

If your puppy is found to have any life threatening issues at the Wellness Check such as: Heart condition, bone disease, cancer we will gladly refund your money.. You must have a written letter from your vet explaining what's wrong with the pup along with vet records. Letter must have the following info: date seen, vet's name, phone number for contact. In certain circumstances, we require a second opinion from the vet of our choice and/or necropsy.

The buyer agrees to postpone strenuous forced exercise until after their said puppy is over one year of age (80% of hip dysplasia is caused by improper exercise. This includes running with your puppy, biking, treadmills, using stairs to exercise, strenuous hikes, etc).

After the 72 hour health guarantee expires the sale is final. If you choose not to take your puppy to your veterinarian, and have it examined within 72 hours, then the health guarantee contract is void, and forfeits all rights to any refund or exchange.

We ask families to reach out to us first if there is a need to rehome a pup. If you got your pup from a third party seller, we can not be held responsible in any way shape or form. This is due to protecting the health of your dog and ours. We hope you understand this policy.



Unless noted, your pup eats two times a day and is generally free fed. They are nourished with:

- Purina Puppy Chow Complete (Blue Bag)
- Mix two teaspoons of Pedigree Wet Food into kibble
- Dollop of Pedigree Wet Food on top (like whip cream on Jell-O)

THESE ITEMS ARE READILY AVAILABLE AT WALMART, DOLLAR GENERAL AND OTHER BIG BOX GROCERY STORES.. PLEASE DO NOT CHANGE YOUR PUPPY'S DIET UNTIL YOUR VET RECOMMENDS TO. YOUR PUPPY'S TUMMY IS FRAGILE AND ABRUPTLY CHANGING THEIR DIET MAY TRIGGER UNINTENDED PROBLEMS.

REMINDERS FOR A HEALTHY START:

- 4 OFF THE FLOOR - Do not let your pup on the ground, grass, parking lot or unsecured outside porch until he/she has had all sets of shots including rabies.
- NOTE: WE DEWORM PUPPIES AT 2 & 4 WEEKS WITH PYRANTEL AND 6 WEEKS WITH PANACUR (Fenbendazole) AND REGULARLY THEREAFTER.
- Snuggle Puppies are great to help ease the transition to their new environment. (Can get at Pet Store or online)
- Do not let other children play with your puppy if they have pets at home. They can unknowingly transmit diseases to your pup.
- Do not change their diet the day you get your new friend. You can gradually change the diet. But, please talk to your vet.
- Place radio/soft music in the room with them for the first few days in a quiet room away from children. Children who are hyper, overly excited, or loud may scare your puppy. For the first few days, the pup may appear shy and/or not eat/drink much while it acclimates to the new environment. Be patient and only use POSITIVE TRAINING Techniques. Consistency is key for training your pup.
- Buy a crate that will be your pet's safe haven. This is also an easy way to house train your puppy. Pee pads are recommended in this process. Puppy play pens are also great to have as you can contain them, and they still have room to play.
- Make sure your house is puppy proofed. You can use baby gates to create barriers. Close toilet lids and place lids on trash cans. Secure any loose electrical cords and pick up laundry (socks, underwear, etc.) as the puppy will likely be looking to chew on things as it goes through the teething stages. They can also swallow small items, potentially causing bowel obstructions which can require an emergency visit to the ER Vet.
- While in the beginning stages of training, you can use a leash to keep the puppy with you at all times indoors to help show them places they can and can't go.

Physical:

- We can NOT guarantee your puppy's size as an adult.
- We can NOT guarantee your puppies coat, texture of fur, or if it will be straight, curly or wavy.
- We can NOT guarantee your puppy will not shed. All dogs shed some, no matter what the breed is.
- We can NOT guarantee your pup's colorings as an adult.

Puppy/Dog Coat Insights for Poodles & Doodles:

- Will change color until age 2 - IE: you may have a black poodle or doodle that could turn chocolate or blue. This does NOT MEAN THAT YOURS WILL.
- A doodle's hair texture can, and will change through their puppy stages until age 2. If you are unfamiliar with doodles then please research them. Doodles will shed a bit during their first year while transitioning from puppy to adult, this is normal.
- Poodles sometimes don't have extremely curly hair as puppies, but will get curlier as they mature. Please remember poodle's hair changes until age 2.
